Program Descriptions

MTI: MIOSHA 10-Hour Course for Construction | This 10-hour program presents an overview of MIOSHA regulations for the construction industry. Students will receive both MIOSHA and OSHA 10-hour cards upon successful completion of the class.

MTI: MIOSHA Recordkeeping & the Cost of Injuries | This MIOSHA program is designed to help employers ensure that their organization complies with MIOSHA recordkeeping requirements as contained in MIOSHA Administrative Rules Part 11, Recording and Reporting of Occupational Injuries and Illnesses.

Legal Series Session I | The webinar will cover: Bids, Bidders and Bid Protests; The Contract for Construction: Standard Forms and Common Risk Transferring Provisions; and Overview of State and Federal Prevailing Wage Law.

Project Manager Development Program- Leadership | This 16-hour course will promote awareness of the difference between leading and managing, the importance of communication in leadership, motivating team members, negotiating solutions, ethical standards and professional responsibilities, and much more.

Supervisory Training Program (STP) Unit 2: Oral and Written Communications | This course presents a body of knowledge and skills that today's construction supervisors need in order to be effective communicators on their jobsite.

Legal Series Session II | The webinar will cover: Contract Changes/Differing Site Conditions; Defective Plans and Specs; Delays in Contract Performance; Concepts in Business Valuation, Potential Financial Statement Impacts and more Accounting, and Tax and Financial Issues.

LEED Green Associate Exam Prep | A new offering of the U.S. Green Building Council's LEED 2009 v3 is the Green Associate (GA) credential. To pass the GBCI exam that awards this professional accreditation, it requires an understanding of the LEED core concepts and strategies, but it does not require the hands-on technical knowledge that, for example, architects and engineers bring to the actual construction or renovation of a building.

Michigan Construction Safety Training Day | This full day event, offered in three locations, provides a general safety program, a professional safety track for advanced training and an executive safety forum. In addition to the training programs, Safety Day provides an exhibitor tradeshow of safety products and services that can assist your safety efforts.

LEED AP Building Design + Construction Exam Prep | Replacing the LEED AP for New Construction exam track, this specialty provides a standard for professionals participating in the design and construction phases of high-performance, healthful, durable, affordable, and environmentally sound commercial, institutional, and high-rise residential buildings.

Project Manager Development Program - Estimating and Job Costing | This 16-hour course will cover an introduction to estimating basics, project planning and setup, estimating for specific tasks, estimating costs not associated with a specific task, estimating costs of work by others, putting estimates into action, estimating redesign and revisions, and project contributions to corporate profits.

EPA Certified Lead Renovators Training | This day long seminar will provide a certificate to individuals who will be designated as "EPA Certified Lead Renovators." EPA is requiring training, by April 22, 2010, for all contractors who work in pre-1978 housing and child-occupied facilities, including: renovation contractors, maintenance workers in multi-family housing, painters and other specialty trades.

MIOSHA/MTI: Fall Protection | Attendees at this training will review the MIOSHA Part 45, Construction Safety Standard for Fall Protection including the latest OSHA and MIOSHA interpretations.

Michigan Construction Industry Professional Development Day | This 7th annual professional development opportunity provides two in-depth educational tracks; one focused on enhancing a safety culture in your organizations and the other on helping to secure continued work for your company, no matter what your job title.

Trade Secrets: Interiors/Roofing/Mechanical | This series is designed to provide a better understanding of systems and components used by various specialty contractors and to provide insight into items that become concerns for them, GC's and CM's during and after a project.

Legal Series Session III | The webinar will cover: Estate and Business Succession Planning for the Contractor; Bankruptcy and the Construction Industry; Dealing with the Media and Press in Corporate Crisis Situations.

Project Manager Development Program - Contract Administration | Understand how basic contracts are structured, how different types of contracts are used, and how project documentation relates to effective contracting. Also, how different project delivery methods use different contracting strategies, and gain insight into contract law and language in relation to project risk.

Supervisory Training Program (STP) Unit 3: Problem | This course will help construction supervisors identify problems, how they occur and learn techniques for solving them in the industry. Supervisors will learn how to use the decision making process and important considerations to take into account.

MIOSHA/MTI: Excavation - A Grave Danger | This workshop will provide an overview of MIOSHA Part 9, Excavations, Trenching, and Shoring. In addition, the electrical hazards and applicable regulations associated will be discussed. It is designed to assist participants in identifying hazards in the workplace, especially those associated with mobile equipment.

Microsoft Excel: Moving to the Next Level | This class takes users beyond the basics to make the most of Excel's features/functions, push skills to the next level, learn additional shortcuts and tips that will boost speed and productivity, and produce more professional looking spreadsheets.

Project Manager Development Program - Project Administration | Gain an awareness of how pre-project planning affects the potential success of a project and understand the different areas of planning for the construction phase of a project.

Project Manager Development Program - Risk Management | Understand types and sources of risk and how risk changes over the phases of a project. Learn techniques for managing risk and how the scope and nature of risk management varies based on contracting methods.
